LOCAL ORAL HISTORY RECORDINGS

My name is Janet Doody and I am local to Madeley. I have begun volunteering with the museum archives and library – I am assisting their archivist Sarah who has been going through the wonderful oral history collection.

During the late 1970's and early 1980's local historian Ken Jones recorded, for the Ironbridge Gorge Museums, a large number of local residents talking about their younger days; at school, at work and generally about living in the area, often prior to the First World War. These valuable memories have recently been digitised making them more accessible; unfortunately in those pre-digital days no images of the participants were taken, so although their voices with their wonderful regional dialects are captured there are no photographs.

I have been tasked with trying to track down photographs, it is more than likely many of the "voices" have descendants who may still live locally and hopefully have kept the odd photo if they can be located.

Small Woods community conservation programme has leapt out of lockdown and back into life! Thanks to the ongoing support of Madeley Town Council, the programme is supporting volunteer involvement in the care of several local green spaces, whilst also boosting the health & wellbeing of those involved...



Due to the onset of bird-nesting season the work is currently focusing on

maintaining access including work to improve path edges at Rough Park, and the replacement of several lots of handrails on pit mound steps with some 'rustic' alternatives. The group have also been working with a local 'friends' group to improve biodiversity of woodland at Sutton Hill Village Green.

During the lockdowns, our local green spaces received huge increases in the number of people enjoying them. Many more people now want to 'give something back' in contributing to keeping these wonderful spaces in as good a condition as possible for local wildlife and people, and there has been a surge of interest in volunteering with the group. Small Woods are even looking into the possibility of running a youth group, following particular interest from young people.

The volunteers meet at 1:30pm every Tuesday afternoon and sessions will start again in September after a Summer break.

Tristan Haynes, the current project supervisor said, "As we look after a range of sites across the Parish we meet every two weeks OUTSIDE Court Street Medical Practice, and either the FORECOURT of Hub on the Hill or Park Lane centre for the weeks in between."

News Madeley from Orchard

Madeley Orchard is situated in the middle of the local community. In normal times It is well used by residents, schools, local clubs, families and local unemployed people as a place to go, a quiet oasis where everyone is welcome. It's 15 or so volunteers, who maintain the garden, have sadly had to close for both Covid lockdowns.

As one of the volunteers I desperately miss the company of our Tuesday work parties. I'm now remembering how when we came back after the first lockdown I noticed how low and withdrawn individuals had become, no one laughed, some of us talked a lot and across each other, words tumbling out like from a boiled over kettle, others said nothing and looked at our feet.

When we first returned I think we were held together by the structure of the workdays. We start in a circle with each of us leading an exercise, giving examples of the 5 steps to mental wellbeing then identifying and choosing the days task. Some of us like to work alone others in small groups but we all come together for an 11 o'clock coffee break and we finish off with a final round of 'cool down' exercises.

When we came back it took several weeks for the sadness of lockdown to begin to work its way out. Gradually the jokes and laughter trickled through and we started being able to listen to each other again. To become less inward looking and more aware of our surroundings. We became a proper group once more, shared wheelbarrows, fetched tools for each other passed the biscuits round and heard the summer bees in our bee friendly border, commented to each other on how the blossom was turning to tiny apples, pears and nuts. We discussed what was on TV tonight, how we nearly caught a big fish in the nearby River Severn, and when the next doctors appointment was.

Coming back after lockdown has reminded me of how vital our group and the way we work together for a common purpose is to each and every one of us.

RBL seeks new Poppy Appeal collectors in Madeley

We have seen a reduction in the number of our collectors following the pandemic, with many still anxious about returning to their normal way of life, but the RBL still has a job to do and we are optimistic that the Appeal will look very different again this time around. The RBL's work is even more vital than ever as we support people from all generations who have new hardships as a result of Covid -19, which has had a devastating impact on people's livelihoods right across **Telford and Wrekin**, leaving some in our Armed Forces community in dire need of help and support."

Every year our Poppy Appeal Organisers (PAOs) play a critical role across the country to meet the huge public demand for our poppies, the nation's symbol of Remembrance.

The Appeal raises about half of the funds we need for our welfare work every year and we will launch the Appeal on October 28, but there is a lot of planning before that date, of course. Anyone who volunteers will receive lots of support and enjoyment from taking part.

Red poppies are worn proudly by the British public from the launch date until Remembrance Sunday or 11 November, whichever is later.

Reverend Dawn Taffinder... Dawn was born and lived in Smethwick until she was 2 when the family moved to Sutton Hill, the first housing estate to be built in what was then Dawley New Town. Dawn went to school at Alexander Fleming and was a pupil there when it got the 'Sir' and was part of the choir who wore the tartan kilts. She then moved to Abraham Darby where she stayed until the end of 6th form. She loved science and maths and was an active member of the music department. Rather than go to University Dawn trained at New Cross Hospital to be a microbiologist. This led her to gain a position at Telford Foods on Halesfield which began her career in the food industry. Dawn has worked in Quality Management in various food companies for over 30 years specialising in dried fruits and nuts.

In 1995, although Dawn had always considered herself a Christian, she felt a call from God which began the journey to where she is today. She took an active role in the lay leadership of Sutton Hill church, where she was Sunday school teacher for 9 years and a member of the PCC. She remained at Sutton Hill Church through her formal training for ministry until she was ordained. She moved to St Michaels for her curacy staying on to become Associate Minister. All through her ministry Dawn continued to work in the food industry until appointed full time Vicar of Sutton Hill & Woodside.
