#### Some interesting stats that I have come across are:



27,000 miles of wrapping paper is used every year

1 billion cards end up in the bin every year!



We waste 250,000 tonnes of food each Christmas, this is the equivalent of 100,000 elephants!



Sessions are very child-led with a nature-based focusrunning throughout. The children learn first-hand about the natural environment and are able to connect with nature. These direct learning experiences are known to have a positive impact on children's wellbeing and development levels and the children thoroughly enjoy them.




Helen Childs, the Forest School leader, said "it has been great getting back into the sessions, we really have missed them. The children just love visiting the woods and spending time outdoors. Recently we have been looking at the changing seasons and how this affects our forest school site. Children seem to be at their happiest when they are outdoors doing different things like jumping in puddles, running down hills or climbing trees"

Forest School sessions last all morning and always end with a nice hot chocolate, snack and little story, which always seems to go down well.

On Thursday 14th October, William Reynolds Primary School launched Times Table Rockstars. During the day, children participated in a range of Mathematical activities and played some Times Table Rockstar Games and everyone enjoyed dressing up as Rockstars for the day

Times Table Rockstars is a fun and challenging programme designed to help children master their times tables. When it comes to times tables, speed AND accuracy are important – the more facts a child remembers, the easier it is for them to do harder calculations. The aim is to answer multiplication facts up to 12 X 12 in less than 3 seconds and rbecome a Time Table Rockstar.

If their recall becomes even quicker they can become a 'Rock Hero' and, finally, a 'Rock God'! All the children, and adults participated and had great fun improving their mathematical knowledge.



The event was supported with a £400 community grant from Madeley Town Council and also by Asda for which we are very grateful. The girls made gifts to take home and give to a prospective new member. Then they did a science project, an environment project and learned a cheerleader dance. Our grateful thanks to Dynamic Dance and Fun Science and the leaders.



We finished with a party tea and a loud sing song outside the Anstice to remind everyone we are here and will welcome new members.

## **Success for Safer and Stronger Communities Project**

#### Final Safer and Stronger event hosted with more to follow in 2022

Residents were invited to have their say on how they would like to see a share of £2.5m spent on further improvements to enrich neighbourhoods and build community safety.

Most of the feedback was positive, however some of the main issues included safer parking locations, anti-social behaviour related to alcohol, noise and a more visible police presence.

Children who were asked said they would like to be more involved with litter picking and keeping the area clean and tidy.

#### Almost 200 people attended the events where a number of teams offered support, including:

- Job Box team helping people take their first steps back into employment, learning opportunities, support with CVs and made referrals to help people find new jobs.
- The Police marked bikes with smart water a traceable liquid that deters theft and were on hand for people to raise any concerns.
- Other success stories included the Energise team supporting a recovering cancer patient and a new mother into exercise classes, more than 50 people signed up to the year of wellbeing, volunteers coming forward to maintain green spaces and signing up for projects while new cyclists joined sessions to build their confidence.

More than £2.5m is being invested in creating support groups and bringing in measures that aim to create safer and stronger communities. Among the borough towns earmarked to benefit - Madeley, Sutton Hill and Woodside are included.
