

QUEEN'S JUBILEE OPENS WINDOW OF OPPORTUNITY FOR HIGH STREET BUSINESSES

High street businesses across Telford and Wrekin can put their stamp on the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations by entering a 'best dressed window' competition. Businesses are being encouraged to give their customers a royal welcome by decorating their windows over the next two months to mark her Majesty's 70 years on the throne.

The competition will coincide with the celebrations and give shops and businesses the chance to enter into the carnival spirit and use it as an opportunity to promote their businesses and services to existing and new customers. Prizes will be up for grabs for the best dressed windows in each of the borough towns which will be judged in the run-up to the Jubilee bank holiday weekend which starts on 2 June.

Entries must be based on a royal/Jubilee theme and the deadline for windows to be completed is Friday 13 May (5pm).

The competition is being staged through Telford & Wrekin Council's Pride in Our High Street programme which supports new and existing businesses and helps them tackle the pressures that high streets face.



HRH Princess Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, visited Madeley on 29th June. 1970. After visiting the New Town area she visited the new shopping centre in Madeley, before finishing the tour looking at points of interest in the Severn Gorge area. She was the first royal to visit the work of the Ironbridge Gorge Museum Trust.

Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh

On the 14th July 1972, the Museum was honoured again by a visit by HRH, the Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh. After a visit to the Telford Town Centre under construction and Brookside, he visited Blists Hill Museum. The tour started with an inspection of the recently excavated and watered section of the canal and the steam engine which apprentices from the REME workshops at Donnington Ordnance depot assisted to restoring. He also saw the vertical steam blowing engine re-erected in the North Engine House and boys from Stoke Heath borsta! institution engaged on restoration of the 1851 beam engines David and Sampson.

Later on the tour he was the guest of Shropshire County Council and the Telford Trust and opened the Court Centre and the Madeley Court School.

On the 10th July 2003 as part of Her Majesty & the Duke of Edinburgh's visit to the town to mark Telford's 40th birthday, the Duke of Edinburgh visited Woodside where he was asked to sound an air horn to ceremonially announce the demolition of The Courts flats.

Prince Philip then moved on to the Enginuity visitor centre at Ironbridge before the Royal Party moved on to Ironbridge and Coalbrookdale where they walked across the Iron Bridge to open a new visitors centre in the old tollhouse.

Princess Anne, The Princess Royal

On the 12th February 1990, The Princess Royal, Princess Anne opened the Telford Hospital which was named the Princess Royal hospital in her honour. During the visit, the Princess spent an hour touring the £27 million complex, and chatted to 13-year-old patient Dawn Taylor and a student nurse. As she left, she was given a tape of two songs recorded by 14-year-old cystic fibrosis sufferer Nigel Brown.

She was the seventh Princess Royal in the British Monarchy, having held the title since June 1987. It is a title traditionally carried by the monarch's oldest daughter and held for life.
