
Big Street Little Feet

Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin NHS Talking Therapies Service for anxiety and depression

If you are struggling with depression, anxiety, stress, low mood, worry, phobias or other mild to moderate mental health and emotional issues, you can access treatment and support through Shropshire, Telford and Wrekin NHS Talking Therapies Service.

The service offers guidance, information and a variety of talking therapies suitable to the needs of the patient, including:

- **Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT)**
- Eye Movement Desensitisation and Reprocessing (EMDR)
- Counselling

The service can also help people with a range of persistent physical symptoms and long-term physical conditions. The service is open to anyone aged over 16 who is registered with a GP in Shropshire or Telford & Wrekin.

Madeley Baptist Church has been pleased to continue its work in the community over the winter period.

'Friendly Faces' starts the week off every Monday afternoon at the Park Lane Centre from 1.00pm to 3.00pm. This friendly meeting was set up after Covid to allow those in the community to get out again and enjoy a time of fellowship, chat and relaxation. Open to everyone. Come and try it.

For the second winter running on Tuesdays and Thursdays our 'Winter Warmers' have been increasingly popular running from 10.00am to 2.00pm. Breakfasts of cereal and toast are provided followed by copious cups of tea and coffee served by a merry band of volunteers. The highlight is the three-course lunch or just soup and a roll if you wish. The fellowship and chat are great and we are indebted for the support and advice provided by Maninplace and the local PCSOs, and in particular the financial support provided by Madeley





Town Council, without which the sessions would not be viable. Numbers have reached up to 50 on occasions but there is still plenty of room. Everyone is most welcome, especially those needing food, heat and fellowship. The regular sessions will continue until the end of March when they will revert to the popular coffee mornings.

On the first and third Tuesday evenings in the month we run a Causeway Group for Adults with Learning Difficulties. These commence at 6.45pm and run to 8.15pm and provide a variety of activities including craft, games and quizzes which the regular attendees really enjoy. This Group has been running since 2007 and provides a much-needed amenity in the area. Again, just come along and try it out.

Arthog is such a great experience and has been for more than sixty years. We are so pleased Telford & Wrekin continue to value it and the professional expertise that goes with it.


The experiences the children had are invaluable and would be tricky to replicate without being based at such a fantastic setting.



New initiative to support gardeners

As part of our ongoing commitment to reducing our carbon footprint, Park Lane Centre swapped our heating and hot water system across to a biomass system a few years ago. This reduces our use of fossil fuels by using renewable energy and as a result we generate ash waste

This makes an excellent nutrient for gardens or to add into compost to enrich it. It is a natural source of potassium which helps flowers and fruit to form and can help reduce the acidity of soil. We are therefore delighted to now be able to offer 'free' ash waste to centre users and local residents. This is thanks to receiving an EnviroGrant from Veolia and Telford and Wrekin Council.

We have purchased 2 large ash storage containers which will be sited by the biomass pod at the back of the building. Anyone wishing to, can help themselves to a ready filled bag and take it away. We hope that local gardeners and allotment holders will find this both practical and beneficial!

Hearing Loss Support Hubs

Hearing Loss Support Hubs are ran by trained volunteers who are able to carry out minor repairs and replace batteries in hearing aids provided specifically by the Audiology department within Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital NHS Trust. From Thursday 14th March Madeley Community Library will host a new monthly support hub to reduce the need to travel to the audiology department for these services.




Let's talk...
