





Madeley **Community Orchard**



When you read this, we hope winter is almost over and you are eagerly awaiting Spring. In the Orchard we have already seen snowdrops and daffodils peeping through the snow, a sign of warmer weather to come. However, the cold, wet months didn't deter our amazing volunteeers. There is always something to do in a garden and the Orchard is no exeption.

Carl has tamed our willow tunnel into shape and cleared the overgrown hedge on the Church side to give the snowdrops more space.

Phil has been maintaining the Peace Garden and has been working on the Leggs Way end, making a new deadwood hedge. He also looks after the camp fires.

Louise is making great headway clearing the currant bushes on the back wall plus planting out the bed by our newly pruned grapevine which we hope will produce well this year. Tim is a jack-of-all-trades and sharpens, fixes and generally maintains our tools.

Carola, Ruth and their band of helpers, Abbie, Genniva, James and Josh, are keeping the bee borders in order and they always look amazing in Spring and Summer.


James has cleared the wall at the top of the Orchard so our young fruit trees can flourish.

And our long term volunteers, Paul, Neil and Andy have worked on keeping the paths clear of leaves and turning the compost.

The Hazle grove is doing well (keeping the squirrels well fed), and our young Walnut trees are now well established. We have found a helpful tree cutter who delivers our much needed wood chip. We have protected most of our trees and will be putting chips on paths and more open areas. Grass cutting is still a problem but not insolvable as we now have a new mower. We'd just like the Summer to be drier this year!

To conclude, we have new, keen, hard working volunters who have joined us including a group from Home Farm Trust. The future of the Orchard is looking good and, with Community support, we will continue to welcome all those who visit to enjoy the beautiful surroundings.

Happy New Year to all our Friends of Rough Park!

Last year we were able to have help from Rick Shaw [Telford and Wrekin] and volunteers from Fujitsu and Capgemini to plant native species bulbs and survey food sources for our endangered butterflies and it is our firm hope that this year we can take further steps to improve our beautiful woodland and green meadows.

We now have new official information boards which highlight the special animal and plant life we can find in Rough Park - some of which is rare or endangered.

Litter has been an issue on Rough Park this year - it is not only unsightly but also a real danger to wildlife. Animals are curious about anything smelling of food and are likely to cut their faces and paws on broken bottles and ring pull holes in drinks cans, they can also get trapped in plastic wrappers and string. So let's take care to put our rubbish and left-overs in the bins - or better still - take it home!! After our requests IdVerde have agreed to empty over-full waste bins more regularly.

Those of you who brought children to Madeley Town Council's Xmas Lights Switch-on Fair and made Xmas cards from leaf prints - I hope you enjoyed learning a new skill. In the Spring as the new leaves sprout you might like to come and see if you can find the leaf you chose and identify the tree too.

Before the Spring, in the mud or snow, you could try tracking and guessing some of the footprints left by squirrels, deer, foxes, badgers, hedgehogs and various birds. Maybe look in your school library for books on wildlife tracks.

Members of our group have recently started sketching and painting to try and record the beauty of Rough Park through the seasons. This group is for adults and if you're interested in joining us once a week on a Monday at 10am we meet at the children's playpark on The Saplings. Bring your own materials etc. warm clothing and something to sit on. This is for fun and not a teaching class!!! But it's often interesting to meet and find out what others are doing.

Adam promoted to team leader for charity that saved his life

A former client has joined the full-time staff at the Woodside charity that saved his life.

Adam Marshall, 45, has taken on the role of team leader at the charity and community interest company A Better Tomorrow which supports people with addiction and substance misuse.

His role puts him in charge of the team dealing with abstinence overseeing ten of the organisation's houses and leading support workers who help clients in their recovery from addiction.


Adam, who lives in Telford, explained that his first involvement with A Better Tomorrow was in 2021 as a client after being addicted to drink and drugs from his early teens.

"When I came to A Better Tomorrow I had ruined every relationship I had ever had, my family wanted nothing to do with me and I was broken. A Better Tomorrow put me on the road to recovery - it saved my life," he said.

Adam started working as a volunteer in 2022 and two years ago took on part-time paid hours until his recent appointment as team leader.

He said his new role involved helping clients to stay on the road to recovery by attending meetings and activities, supporting them through mental health challenges and helping them with benefits and debt relief.

"Becoming a volunteer and later being a paid support worker just felt like the natural thing to do. Others had given their knowledge, patience and tolerance to me and saved my life so it just seemed the right thing to be giving something back.



"Now, to be given the chance to lead that department is a huge privilege and is very humbling. It doesn't feel like work - I just looking forward to going in every day," he said.

A Better Tomorrow was set up in 2014 to give support to people with addiction and substance misuse. It now provides accommodation and services to support over 700 clients and works closely with Telford & Wrekin Council.

Survivors of domestic abuse urged to help shape Telford services

Survivors of domestic abuse are being given the chance to help shape the future of support services across Telford & Wrekin.

The Lived Experience Advisory Forum (LEAF) has compiled a special online survey to gain feedback from anyone who has been subjected to domestic abuse in the borough and accessed any support service.

LEAF - a joint project between community interest companies A Better Tomorrow of Woodside and Voices Social Enterprise – says it wants as many people as possible to complete the survey to give it the fullest picture.

Tracey Secker, the founder of Voices Social Enterprise, said: "We really want to hear from anyone who has been subjected to domestic abuse and accessed any services to support them in Telford. The more people we hear from, the better we will be able to ensure that when services are planned and developed they are what people actually need and want.

The survey can be accessed at LEAF feedback (Lived Experience Advisory Forum)

LEAF, which is funded by Telford & Wrekin Council, was estab-

lished last year to empower survivors of domestic abuse to use their experience to make suggestions about the Telford & Wrekin domestic abuse strategy and its services, along with other frontline and community organisations and groups.

Courses on domestic abuse awareness are also being staged on January 16, 23 & February 27, whilst training for domestic abuse workplace ambassadors will take place on February 6, 28 and March 13.

Voices Social Enterprise delivers domestic abuse awareness training for organisations and individuals, along with supporting organisations to create domestic abuse policies.

A Better Tomorrow, based in Woodside, Telford, was set up in 2014 to offer supported housing and a recovery programme for people with addiction and substance misuse. Its work has since expanded to include housing and support for those with mental health issues and homeless people, and most recently to provide a refuge for single women fleeing domestic abuse.

We are also excited to be welcoming back on a regular basis the wonderful Elaine, a local nurse practitioner, with decades of experience and a passion for supporting women's health.

Walk for your wellbeing

Did you know that Madeley now has its own Ramblers Wellbeing Walk? Madeley Town Council, working in partnership with Telford & Wrekin CVS and the Ramblers, were able to introduce the new walk in September and it is proving to be rather popular with local residents.

The walk takes place every Thursday, meeting outside the front of The Anstice at 11am. You'll be met by your trained volunteer walk leader who will guide you on a local walk for approximately an hour. You don't need to have the speed and fitness of Mo Farah to take part, just the ability to walk up to two and a half miles in an hour.

The walks are designed to be an opportunity to take in your local surroundings, enjoy being outside in the fresh air whatever the weather, and perhaps chat to others who are also taking part. It's a great opportunity to work on improving your wellbeing.

Our regular walk leader, Dilys, even incorporates local history sights into some of the walks, creating talking points among the group, whether walkers are local and know the area well, or less local and keen to see what "old" Madeley was.

With an important part of the walk being about bringing people together, the chat can and does always continue once the walk ends. The Wellbeing Walk always finishes at the Madeley Wellbeing Community Café, so you are well placed for a cuppa and maybe even a treat. It has become a regular habit for many of the walkers to relax afterwards, and the lovely menu on offer and reasonable prices make it even more worthwhile.

Why not come along and give it a try? There's no need to book, just be at the front of the Anstice by 11am on a Thursday.

CVS - Service to be confirmed Nurse from Court Street Practice Rev. Andy Ackroyd - St. Michael's Church





Blood Pressure Checking – Weekly service with trained volunteers able to check your blood pressure and advise you of next steps if your numbers show concern.

Healthy Lifestyles – Weekly service offering information, advice and support whether you want to eat better, drink less, exercise more, reduce your weight, stop smoking, or lower your blood pressure, cholesterol or risk of developing type two diabetes.

Social Prescribers - Weekly service. Social prescribers are embedded within local GP surgeries alongside GPs and other practice staff aiming to connect you to community services and activities that support your health and wellbeing using a therapeutic approach, as well as providing practical, helpful and non-judgemental support.

Independent Living Centre – The Independent Living Centre offers both preventative and responsive support to individuals to enable them and their families to live well and safe in their community, potentially remaining independent in their own homes for longer.

People can come along to receive support around daily living as well as access the wide-ranging information, advice and sign-posting the centre offer. As well as receiving advice and support you'll be able to see and try a number of "gadgets" that can make independent living a reality.

Telford & Wrekin CVS – Weekly service, but with focus on different service areas each week

SENDIASS - Telford and Wrekin SENDIASS service provides access to impartial and independent information about Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND), health and social care for children, young people and their parents and carers.

We can give you information in relation to SEND law to enable you to participate in and make informed decisions regarding your child's education, as well as supporting you to prepare for meetings, explaining and understanding reports, listening to your views and concerns and ultimately work to build positive outcomes.

Young Carers – The Young Carers Service provides advice and support for all young carers in Telford from age 5 to 18 offering one-to-one support, term-time Youth Club, holiday and half term activities, trips and events, school drop-ins information and advice for the whole family and more.

If you think you're a young carer or you know a child or young person who is caring, come along and speak to us for more information and advice.

Carers Team - The Carers Team support and enable unpaid family carers, over the age of 18, to improve their quality of life and to be more confident and able in their caring role. The team can provide listening ear and give support when it is needed most, help access available support and services, create opportunities to have a voice in the planning and development of services, access appropriate financial support, provide up to date information, and access support groups that provide an opportunity to socialise and take a break from their caring role, share information, gain support and discuss topics of interest with carers in similar situations. If you, or someone you know is an adult carer, come and have a chat.

Telford Autism Hub – Come and speak to us about all aspects of adult autism including understanding more about autism, support to find out if you are autistic, how to access other help and support, as well as opportunities to meet and socialise with others and support to become more confident and independent.

Telford Children's Autism Hub - Whether your child has just received a diagnosis, or you are looking for information to help your child flourish out team are here to offer you guidance and support. Our Children's Autism Hub is open to all children

and young people aged 0-18, and their families, who have a diagnosis of Autism.

To access our Children's Autism Hub you need to be a resident of Telford and Wrekin.

Citizen's Advice Bureau (CAB) – Come along and chat to an advisor if you're looking to make your money go further, are unsure if you might be entitled to benefits, or think you might be paying too much for you gas and electricity. We will have access to advice and bookings on the day.

Telford Crisis Support – Many individuals are now finding themselves in crisis for a number of reasons. Telford Crisis Support is here to help with a wide range of emergencies, including food, school uniform, winter coats and shoes, providing for the needs of babies and toddlers, advice on money worries and providing link worker support. If you, or someone you know, are struggling, come in and see how Telford Crisis Support can help.

Livelife Cancer Awareness - Through direct contact with people of all ages the LiveLife Cancer Awareness Service works to break down some of the barriers people may have in talking about cancer. Raising awareness of the importance of early diagnosis and signs & symptoms, providing free, evidence based, high quality information and resources. Come in and find out about the different cancer screenings available and what signs and symptoms you should be looking out for.

Learn Telford – Learn Telford aims to widen the participation so as many sections of the community as possible can experience the joy and wider benefits that taking part in learning can bring, such as improved confidence and wellbeing, reduced social isolation and much more. The service also aims to support adults to improve their skills and therefore increase their chance of employment and progression.

Admiral Nurses – Dementia UK - Admiral nurses support families living with dementia. When things get challenging Admiral Nurses work alongside you to give expert advice, one to one support and practical solutions that families need that can be hard to find elsewhere, helping them live more positively with dementia. Admiral Nurses are continually trained, developed and supported by Dementia UK.

Nurse – Court Street Medical Practice – Nurses will participate with the blood pressure checking and seek to keep patients informed about services available, such as appropriate screenings for their age group, as well as asking patients about their general health in order to recommend making appointments or seeking more support.

Age UK – Age UK Shropshire Telford & Wrekin is an independent local charity with over 50 dedicated staff and more than 400 volunteers helping to deliver services and activities for older people in Shropshire and Telford & Wrekin. Find out more about local services which can help you or a family member, or how you can get involved to help people in your area.

Community Resource - Buddy System - The Buddy System pairs a volunteer with someone who feels isolated and alone, supporting them to take part in local activities, make new friends and get more active. The support from a Buddy will enable participants to take a crucial first step to take part in something new. That encouragement and motivation will help reduce isolation and boost confidence and self-esteem.

Could you offer encouragement and motivation to help someone become more involved in the local community? Or do you know someone who may need a Buddy and want to know how to get them referred? Pop in and speak to Community Resource.

Smallwoods – Smallwoods Association (SWA) aims to promote sustainable management of woodlands, for benefits now and into the future. Projects include Build a Bench, Wellbeing in Nature sessions, Into the Woods and Woodland Biodiversity projects.



Projects are aimed at different groups, including veterans and those referred through green social prescribing, and aim to improve the health and wellbeing of participants.

Rev. Andy Ackroyd - St. Michael's Church - Whether you are part of the local church or not, everyone is welcome to come and speak to Reverand Ackroyd for advice and support. You may also wish to offer your help to get involved with the community through the work that the church does. However you wish to support or be supported, do come and have a chat.

It is a very simple blood test which will take up about 15 minutes of your Saturday afternoon.

The Wrekin Housing Group and Housing Plus Group have merged, becoming one of the largest social housing providers in the West Midlands.

The new Housing Plus Group has pledged to continue to work with and listen to customers, after 3,500 people responded to the merger consultation. It plans to invest an additional £55 million in existing homes and will be a key developer of new homes over the next 5 years.

Customers are also being reassured that the merger will not affect the services they currently receive. It will also not affect rent or service charges - which are set in line with government guidance.

While the merger now complete, there is still a lot of work to do to bring services together, so, for now, 'The Wrekin Housing Group' will continue to be used as a trading name. The group will continue to keep customers updated.



Community Activities at Madeley Baptist Church Go from Strength to Strength

The welcoming environment of Madeley Baptist Church (MBC) is proving a hit with locals and as a result the services and activities on offer are continuing to grow.

The church's flag-ship project 'Winter Warmers', which is part of the Warm Spaces initiative, regularly sees upwards of fifty people attend the Tuesday and Thursday sessions that provide friendship, free refreshments and hot meals. In the build-up to Christmas, MBC provided a Christmas party with all users of the church invited, followed a few days later by a turkey lunch.

Alongside the friendship aspect of Winter Warmers, support teams from Christians Against Poverty (CAP), Maniplace, Wrekin Housing Trust, MIND and most recently, The Job Box, provide the opportunity for confidential conversation without the need to make an appointment.

Together with Winter Warmers every Tuesday and Thursday, 10 am 'til 2 pm, MBC opens its doors on the first and third Tuesday evenings in the month to 'Causeway', a group for adults with additional learning needs. From 6:45 pm 'til 8:15 pm there is the opportunity to meet with others and participate in a variety of enjoyable activities including craft, games and quizzes.

On the fourth Wednesday of the month, 10 am 'til noon, MBC hosts 'In the Loop', an all-age group for ladies which is proving a great way to make friends. Many of our ladies also like to craft and are encouraged to bring their own projects along or get involved in group activities. At the moment, banners are being made for the church.




For younger members of the community, MBC runs 'Frantic Friday', a youth club for 8 – 16-year-olds. Providing Friendship, faith, and fun, the group meet every fourth Friday of the month, 7 pm 'til 9 pm.

Saturday mornings MBC accommodates the 'Food Share, Waste Prevention Project', which from 11 am 'til noon is open for people to just drop-in. Earlier, booked slots for those most in need are available by prior arrangement.

On Monday's between 1:00 pm and 3:00 pm, MBC expands its outreach by providing a friendship group for all ages at the Park Lane Centre. 'Friendly Faces@Woodside' was originally setup to help people recover from isolation after Covid, but due to its on-going popularity continues to provide a relaxed meeting place for the local community.

Then there is of course Sunday Morning Worship starting at 10:30 am; usually lasting for just over an hour and including groups for young people. A Prayer Meeting is held every Wednesday, starting at 7:14 pm.





None of the services the church provides would be possible without its dedicated team of volunteers. Originally, volunteers were all members of MBC, however over time people from other churches have come forward, as have individuals who enjoyed the meetings so much that they wanted to become more involved. New volunteers are always welcome.

MBC is extremely grateful for the on-going support of all its volunteers, the help provided by Madeley Town Council, and local businesses.

Nine Men of Madeley

The Nine Men of Madeley refers to a tragic accident that occurred at the Brick Kiln Leasow Pit in Madeley on 27th September 1864. They were being winched up the shaft at the end of their day's work when the chains on which they were sitting became detached from the hook on the winding rope. 3 men and 6 boys plunged to the bottom of the shaft, 200 feet below. They were all buried side by side in a grave in St Michaels Churchyard and a large stone memorial recorded their names. Due to the weathering of the stone making the text virtually unreadable, and the grave in a very bad state of repair, Madeley Living History Group were successful in obtaining a large grant in 2003 to fund a wonderful restoration project. The cast iron railings and individual grave identity covers together with the brickwork surround were all repaired and painted and a new Memorial Plaque erected on a lectern adjacent to the communal grave. It all looked wonderful.

In the late Spring of last year during a visit by a member of Madeley History Group it was noted that the Memorial Plaque was looking shabby and difficult to read, with the paint peeling off. Our group wanted to ensure that the Nine Men of Madeley would never be forgotten, and a plan was conceived to return the plaque to pristine condition, including correcting an error in the text.

Permission was sought from the Clergy and Church Wardens of St Michaels Church to carry out a refurbishment of the Memorial Plaque. This permission was enthusiastically given.

Madeley History Group then had to consider funding for the restoration. We applied to Madeley Town Council for a Grant to help with the cost, as we are a small group with limited funds.



We are extremely grateful to the Town Council for the donation they were able to give us, which made the project affordable.

We awarded the refurbishment work to Madeley Brass Castings, a small local family business. When the Plaque was nearing completion we informed the new Vicar of St Michaels, The Rev. Andy Ackroyd and he agreed to officiate at a re-dedication of the Memorial Plague to The Nine Men of Madeley.

On Monday 11th November 2024, with the sun shining on us, Rev. Andy conducted the Rededication. The service was attended by members from Madeley History Group, the deputy Town Clerk and staff from Madeley Brass Castings and members of the public.

It was a very thought-provoking service, with wonderful words from Rev. Ackroyd. If you are not familiar with the story of The Nine Men of Madeley, I would recommend that you visit the Grave. It really does put things into perspective.

Madeley History Group wish to thank Madeley Town Council, Madeley Brass Castings for their excellent work in refurbishment of the Memorial Plaque and the Rev. Andy Ackroyd for bringing our project to fruition.
